**SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER APPROVING ASSIGNEE'S
FIRST OMNIBUS EXCEPTION MOTION TO EXPUNGE, REDUCE
AND/OR ALLOW CERTAIN CLAIMS IN THE FLEER
COLLECTIBLES CASE WITH RESPECT TO PSS
TRANSPORTATION, INC. AND ALEXANDER GRASS**

This matter having been opened to the Court upon the Assignee's First Verified Omnibus Exception to Claims of Creditors (the "Exception Motion") filed on October 21, 2005¹, and the Court having reviewed all pleadings submitted in support of and in opposition to the requested relief, and the Court having held a hearing on the Exception Motion and entered an Order with respect to the Exception Motion on Thursday, November 10, 2005, at which time the claims of MLB Properties, Inc. ("MLBP"), PSS Transportation, Inc. ("PSS"), and Alexander Grass were all adjourned to Friday, November 18, 2005, and the Court having been advised that the MLBP

claim was resolved at the November 18, 2005 hearing as described in the First Supplemental Order to the Exception Motion, and the claims of PSS and Alexander Grass having been further to Friday, December 9, 2005, and the Court having been advised that the Assignee, PSS and Alexander Grass have reached agreements regarding their respective claims in this matter as set forth below, and for good cause shown;

It is on this 9th day of December, 2005, Ordered that:

1. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2A:19-29, the claims of PSS are hereby allowed as set forth in more detail in the Consent Order Resolving Notice of Exceptions to Claims Regarding PSS Warehousing and Transportation, Inc.
2. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 2A:19-29, the \$2,050,000.00 claim asserted by Alex Grass in this matter shall be transferred to the Fleer/SkyBox case (Docket No. P-2005-1394) and shall be subject to a further review by the Assignee and his staff who expressly reserve all rights with respect to such claim.
3. The Assignee is authorized and empowered to take such actions as may be necessary and appropriate to implement the terms of this Order.
